Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, be, and he is hereby directed to pay to William W. Higgins, or order, the sum of nine dollars and seventy-two cents, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Resolution in favor of Leah Winbrough, widow of Thomas P. Winbrough, a Revolutionary Soldier.

Passed Feb. 2, 1832

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to Leah Winbrough, widow of Thomas P. Winbrough, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to her order, during her widowhood, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services of her husband during said war.

Resolution in favour of Gideon Pearce, and for other purposes.

Passed Jan. 30, 1832

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby required to pay to Gideon Pearce, or to his order, five hun-
