Resolution relating to the obstructions in the Susquehanna River. Passed Feb. 10, 1832

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That his excellency, the governor, be, and he is hereby requested forthwith to take such measures as he, by, and with the advice and consent of the council may deem expedient to prevent the reconstruction or repair of the Muncy, and Shamokin Dams, in the Susquehanna river, state of Pennsylvania, which obstructions to the free navigation of said river have been recently carried away.*

Resolution relative to equalizing the donations granted to the Academies and Schools in the several counties of the state. Passed Feb. 17, 1832

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore equalize the donations granted to the academies and schools, in the several counties of this state, so as to give eight hundred dollars for each county, to be paid by him to the said academies and schools, ratably for each of those counties, which do not now receive that sum.*
