No. 44.

Resolution in favor of Mary Easom, the widow of a Revolutionary Soldier. Passed Feb. 23, 1832

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to Mary Easom, of Dorchester county, widow of Evans Willin, a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, during her widowhood, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband during said war.

No. 45.

Resolution relative to removing certain obstructions in the head waters of Chester river. Passed Feb. 24, 1832

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay or cause to be paid to the order of the governor, from time to time, in such sums of money as may be drawn for, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, the same to be applied to the removal of the impediments in Chester river, from Sutton's Point to the town of Millington, under the direction of the commissioners heretofore appointed by a resolution, number seventy-two, of December session eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, and the said commissioners shall not draw for any part or parcel of the sum hereby appropriated, until they, or a majority of them, shall certify to the governor, that they have contracted for the removal of the impediments aforesaid, and have taken bond, with security, by them approved, in a penalty of double the amount hereby appropriated, to secure the performance of the same, and that the commissioners aforesaid, shall report to the next General Assembly of Maryland, an estimate of the whole expenditure thereof.
