Resolution in favour of Levin D. Collier.

Passed Mar. 5, 1833

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to Levin D. Collier, or to his order, the sum of thirty-five dollars, being amount of his account for provision and forage furnished to the militia in Somerset and Worcester counties, in October last.

Resolution in favour of Fielding Lucas, Junior.

Passed Mar. 5, 1833

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to Fielding Lucas, Junior, or to his order, the sum of three hundred and seventy-nine dollars and forty-eight cents, for a balance due to him for books furnished to the state library.

Resolution in favor of Jonathan Kershner, and James P. Bayles.

Passed Mar 6, 1833

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Jonathan Kershner, of Hagers Town, Washington county, Maryland, and James P. Bayles, of Baltimore city, be, and they are severally released from any further payment to the state of Maryland, on a recognizance to said state, entered into by the said Jonathan and James, on the fourteenth day of May, eighteen hundred and thirty, before Thomas P. Bayles, a justice of the peace of the city of Baltimore.
