No. 99.

Resolution in favour of Leonard Bean.

Passed Mar. 2, 1832

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to Leonard Bean, of Mason county, Kentucky, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.

Resolution in favour of Captain Henry H. Johns.

Passed Mar. 12, 1832

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the armourer at Annapolis, be, and he is hereby required, to deliver to Captain Henry H. Johns, of Harford county, a number of swords and pistols, not exceeding fifty of each, with appropriate accoutrements, which the said armourer may select, on his giving such security for the safe keeping and return of the same, as the governor and council may require:

Resolution in favour of the Clerk of the Court of Appeals.

Passed Mar. 12, 1832

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorised and directed, to allow to the clerk of the court of appeals for the western shore, such compensation as to them may seem right, for making an alphabetical index to the extracts of deeds or other papers, which by law passed at this session, he is directed to make for such deeds or other extracts relating to Saint Mary's county, any law passed at this session, to the contrary notwithstanding.
