

tion of said court, to pay over and transfer any money or property belonging to the estate of the said Joseph Fogle, to any trustee that may now or hereafter be appointed by the circuit court of Nelson county aforesaid, in the state of Kentucky, to receive the same; *Provided*, that the said court of Frederick county sitting as aforesaid, shall be satisfied that the trustee applying for any money or other property by virtue of this act, has executed a bond to the state of Kentucky, with security approved by the said court in Kentucky, conditioned, as well for the faithful conveyance of such money or property, or the value thereof in money, to the person or persons entitled to receive the same, as for the performance of his trust in that state.

Proviso.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That any receipt for the payment of the money or transfer of the property aforesaid, made by any trustee in pursuance of any order or decree in the premises, made by Frederick county court, sitting as a court of equity, which shall be acknowledged before any justice of the peace for Frederick county, may be recorded in the clerk's office of said county, and that a copy of such receipt, acknowledged and recorded as aforesaid, duly attested under the seal of the office in which the same shall have been recorded, shall at all times hereafter be admitted as evidence in any court of law or equity in this state, to prove such payment or transfer.

Receipt—recorded evidence.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the clerk of Frederick county court, may ask, demand and receive such fee for recording the same as is allowed by law in other cases of a similar nature.

CHAPTER 71.

*An act for the benefit of Elizabeth Dodson Hopkins, Theodore Denny Hopkins, and Hester Maria Hopkins, of Talbot county, children of Eliza Hopkins of said county.*

Passed Feb. 6, 1832

WHEREAS, Eliza Hopkins of Talbot county, by her petition in writing, hath set forth that a certain Terence Doores of said county, by his last will and testament duly executed and recorded, devised certain real estate to the said Eliza Hopkins, by the name of Eliza Doores, alias Eliza Dodson, during her life, and upon her death to Margaret Ann Doores and William Doores, children of said Eliza Dodson, in fee; and did farther represent that the said Margaret Ann Doores and William Terence Doores are since dead,
