CHAPTER 111.

Passed Mar. 5, 1836 *A supplement to an act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-five, chapter thirty-six, relating to the Trustees of the Alms House, for Caroline county.*

Per diem allowed trustees

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the passage of this act, the trustees for the Alms House for Caroline county, shall be each entitled to charge and receive the sum of one dollar for each and every day they may attend at the Alms House in said county, and also the same mileage as is now by law allowed to jurors and witnesses for attending the county court; the same to be made out, levied and collected as other county charges are.

CHAPTER 112.

Passed Mar. 4, 1836 *A supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate Frederick Town, in Frederick county.*

Authority in relation to bawdy houses, &c.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Aldermen and Common-Council shall have full power and authority to enact and pass all laws and ordinances necessary to prohibit or restrain the keeping of bawdy-houses, or houses of ill-fame, within the limits of said corporation, to restrain and prohibit all loose and suspected persons from resorting to, frequenting, living, or residing in any such bawdy house, or house of ill-fame, in said town; to provide
