CHAP. 20.

An Act to authorise the Clerk of Kent county, to record a deed therein mentioned. Passed Jan. 29, 1835

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Authorised to record—made valid
That the Clerk of Kent county, be and he is hereby authorised to record a deed of manumission, from Sophia Beck, of said county, to Negro Ezekiel, otherwise called Ezekiel Forman, therein named, and that the said deed when so recorded, to have the same force and effect as if it had been regularly recorded in the the time required by the act of Assembly, passed at November session seventeen hundred and ninety six, chapter sixty seven, any law to the contrary notwithstanding, provided nothing in this act shall effect bona fide purchasers.

CHAPTER 20.

An Act to authorise the Commissioners of Washington county, to appoint Commissioners to review a certain road in said county, and for other purposes. Passed Jan. 26, 1836

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Commissioners to review, and ascertain damages, &c.
That the Commissioners of Washington county be, and they are hereby authorized to appoint three disinterested persons, citizens of said county, as commissioners to review the road heretofore laid out and opened from John Doub's Mill to intersect the Turnpike Road at Benjamin Emmerts, or so much thereof as passes through the lands of Peter Newcomer, to ascertain what additional damages if any, the said Newcomer may be entitled to, and to report the result of their investigation to the commissioners of the county for their approval.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* Levy directed
That the county commissioners be, and they are hereby authorized to levy the amount of damages so assessed by the commissioners appointed by them as aforesaid, upon the assessable property of said county, and to collect and pay the
