CHAPTER 183.

*An act to divorce Elizabeth Baker, of the City of Annapolis, from her husband William Baker.* Passed Mar. 23, 1836

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Elizabeth Baker, of the City of Annapolis, be and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutual cohabitation with her husband William Baker.* Divorce

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted, That said William Baker shall not by virtue of his marriage with the said Elizabeth Baker, be authorised to have or claim any right or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said Elizabeth Baker, whether acquired in any manner whatever, after the passage of this act; nor shall the said Elizabeth Baker be authorised to have or claim any right or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said William Baker, whether acquired in any manner whatever, after the passage of this act.* Responsibilities annulled

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted, That the aforesaid Elizabeth Baker be, and she is hereby declared to be entitled to the custody and guardianship of her children by the said William Baker, during their minority.* Guardianship

CHAPTER 184.
