CHAP. 191.

CHAPTER 190.

An act to divorce Mary Hammer, of the City of Baltimore, from her husband James J. Hammer. Passed Mar. 25, 1836

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* Mary Hammer, of the city of Baltimore, be, and she is hereby divorced *a vinculo matrimonii*, from her husband James J. Hammer. Divorce

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted, That* the said James J. Hammer shall not be liable for any debt to be hereafter contracted by the said Mary Hammer, nor be entitled to any property or estate, which she may hereafter acquire. Liabilities annulled

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted, That* nothing in this act shall be so construed as to effect the legitimacy of any children of the said James J. Hammer and Mary Hammer, or to prevent him, her, or them, from inheriting property, real or personal, in the same manner as if this act had not passed. Inheritance

CHAPTER 191.

An act to authorise the commissioners of Cecil County to levy a sum of money for the purpose of erecting additional buildings to the Alms house of said county. Passed Mar. 25, 1836

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* the commissioners of Cecil county, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered at their discretion to levy on the assessable property of said county in addition to the levy now authorised by law, a sum of money not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars for the purpose of erecting an additional build- Levy authorised
