CHAPTER 197.

An act for the relief of Thomas Carbett, of Washington County. Passed Mar. 24, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Insolvent laws extended to
That the County Court of Washington county, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Thomas Carbett, of Washington county, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly, passed for the relief of Insolvent Debtors; *Provided*, the said Thomas Carbett shall in all respects, except that of proving residence, comply with the requisitions of said acts of Assembly, and that he satisfy the said court that he did not come into this State, with the view of obtaining the benefit of said law.

An act for the relief of Robert A. Farrell and Edward Stiff, of the City of Baltimore. Passed Mar. 24, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Insolvent laws extended to
That the commissioners of Insolvent Debtors, for the city of Baltimore, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Robert A. Farrell and Edward Stiff, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly, passed for the relief of Insolvent Debtors; *Provided*, the said Robert A. Farrell and Edward Stiff shall in all respects, except that of proving residence, comply with the requisitions of said
