

CHAP. 218. ate in said county, near a place called and known by the name of Lewis Town, for such price as she may deem reasonable, and which the Orphans' Court of said county shall approve; *Provided*, that after she shall have made such sale, she shall, if required by the Orphans' Court, give additional security in such penalty as the said Orphans' Court shall prescribe, for the just and faithful disbursement and expenditure of the money arising from the sale of the said house and lot, for the maintenance and education of her infant ward and child Jonathan Leonard; *and provided*, that before the said sale shall be made, the said Orphans' Court first decree the same to be made upon petition by said Jonathan Leonard, by his guardian or next friend, and after being satisfied by evidence in such form as it may direct, that a sale will be for the advantage of said Jonathan Leonard.

CHAPTER 218.

Passed Mar 24 1836 An act to incorporate the Leonard Town Academy, in St. Mary's County.

WHEREAS, application has been made to this General Assembly of Maryland, for the passage of a law to incorporate the Leonard Town Academy, in St. Mary's County:—Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Joseph Harris, Gerard N. Causin, Doct. Joseph Stone, Cornelius Combs, Doct. Charles Ll. Gardiner, Doct. John Delany, Doct. Walter H. Briscoe, Bennett Gough, William Smith, William Coad, Morris Shanks, George Crane, Richard H. Miles, Benjamin G. Harris, Thomas W. Morgan, Luke E. Barber, William T. Maddox, John Walton, George Combs, and H. G. S. Key, or so many of them as may become subscribers to the amount of one hundred dollars each to the capital stock for the erection and support of the academy, be, and they are hereby appointed Trustees of the said Academy, and if any of the said Trustees, qualified as such, shall die, resign, re-
