Commissioners to estimate damages Maryland, That Alexander Fridge, Ashton Alexander

and Charles Howard, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, with authority under oath, to examine, enquire into, estimate and make return to the Treasurer of the Western Shore, of the value of the amount of injury done to the property belonging to [James] White, late of the city of Baltimore, injured or destroyed by a mob in the city of Baltimore, on or about the twenty-seventh day of July, eighteen hundred and twelve; provided, the same be established on oath, and also to ascertain whether any, and what part of the loss and injury sustained as aforesaid, has been recovered and made good to the said Jane White, or her legal representatives, by or from the occupant of her said property, or by its assailants, or by any of them.
