CHAPTER 284.

An act to allow Mary Magruder, of Prince George's county, to bring into this State a negro woman therein named. Passed April 1, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Authority to bring in
 That it shall and may be lawful for Mary Magruder, of Prince George's county, to bring into this State her negro woman named Grace, about sixty years of age; *Provided,* the said Mary Magruder, shall within thirty days after she shall bring into this State the said negro woman Grace, make affidavit that the said negro woman is a slave for life, and shall deposit said affidavit with the clerk of Prince George's county court, to be by him recorded; *And provided,* the said Magruder shall pay, within thirty days after she shall bring the said negro woman into this State, the sum of five dollars, to be by him paid over to the Treasurer of the Western Shore, for the use and benefit of the colonization society. CHAPTER 285.

An act to incorporate the Globe Insurance Company of Baltimore. Passed Mar 30, 1836

WHEREAS, the following named persons having formed themselves into an association for the insurance of vessels and merchandise, and the lending of money on bottomry and respondentia, have prayed for a charter of incorporation:—Therefore.
