

appointed one of the justices of the peace in and for said county; *and whereas*, the said Isaiah Taylor, at the time of the last annual appointment, was again re-appointed, but by a clerical error he was commissioned under the name of Josiah, instead of Isaiah Taylor, and the said Taylor having continued to act as a justice of the peace for a considerable time before the error as aforesaid was discovered,—Therefore:

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Acts confirmed
That all the acts and deeds done by Isaiah Taylor as a justice of the peace for Harford county, from the time of his last appointment until the passage of this act, be and they are hereby confirmed and declared valid, and of as full effect to all intents and purposes as if he had been commissioned under his proper name.

CHAPTER 34.

An act to limit the sitting of the Commissioners of the Tax, in Montgomery county. Passed Jan. 29, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Times of meeting prescribed
That the Commissioners of the Tax for Montgomery county shall sit for the purpose of hearing appeals and noting transfers, on the first Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in April, the first Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in June, and four days to be by themselves agreed upon, in the month of September, in each and every year; *provided nevertheless*, that if the commissioners aforesaid shall be prevented by sickness, or any other good reason, from forming a board on any of the days before mentioned, it shall be lawful for said commissioners to adjourn to, or fix upon some other day or days for the performance of their duties; *provided also*, that they shall not sit more than ten days in any one year.
