Maryland, in such sum as the commanding officer of CHAP. 295, the division shall require for the faithful performance. of his duties as paymaster, that is to say, for the safe keeping of all monies paid into his hands by the collector, and for the keeping and returning a true and just account of the same to the commanding officer of the division, when thereunto required, also for the paying over the whole or such parts of said monies as may be drawn for by him for repairs of arms, expenses of music and other incidental expenses also, for the paying over any surplus or balance in his hands, when thereunto required by the commanding officers of the said two divisions, acting as a board as hereinafter provided for, and the said paymaster shall be allowed His commissions such commissions and shall conform to such regulations as may be established by the commanding officer of the division; and if any officer shall neglect or refuse to Fine for neglect comply with the provisions of this section as required of him, he shall be fined a sum of money not exceeding fifty dollars, in the discretion of such court martial as the case may require.

SEC. 15. And be it enacted, That the commanding As to control of surplus funds officers of the two divisions aforesaid, shall be a board to control any surplus funds in the hands of the paymaster of either of said divisions, and if the funds of one division prove inadequate for the expenses thereof they shall be supplied from the surplus funds of the other division, and if any surplus funds remain after Appropriation thereof paying the expenses of both divisions, the same shall be invested in some productive fund, in the name of the State, in trust for the establishment of an arsenal or earsenals, and drill room or drill rooms, in the city of Baltimore.

SEC. 16. And be it enacted, That in said divisions As to tactics and discipline there shall be adopted the system of tactics and discipline now practiced in the army of the United States; that the companies of cavalry, artillery and infantry officered shall be officered in like manner, as those of the army of the United States of the corresponding arms, and that to each company of riflemen shall be attached one captain and three lieutenants; each company to adopt Uniform such uniform as they may agree upon; and all officers
