SEC. 9. *And be it enacted,* That the clerk of Montgomery county court shall annually, without fee or reward, make out for the trustees of primary school districts, in said county, or such of them as shall apply for the same, copies from the assessment books of said county, of all the assessable property in said district or districts. Duty of clerk

SEC. 10 *And be it enacted,* That all acts repugnant to or inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed. Repeal

CHAPTER 297.

An act relating to the Baltimore Markets.

Passed Mar. 31, 1836

WHEREAS, it has been represented to this General Assembly, by the memorial of sundry citizens of this State, that the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, have passed an ordinance imposing a tax of twelve and a half cents, upon each and every person who attend the Baltimore Markets, with produce or articles of any description from the county, to vend in said markets, without regard to the value of the produce or articles, so offered for sale as aforesaid, and whereas the said tax is deemed to be unequal, unjust and oppressive:—Therefore, Preamble

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, that no charge, tax, fee or fees shall be set, rated or levied upon any person, or the property of any person who shall attend any of the Baltimore Markets, with any articles or produce from the country, to vend in said markets of their own growth, produce or manufacture, or as the agent of the grower, producer or manufacturers of the same, provided such person or agent, be not a resident of the city of Baltimore, unless such person or persons shall occupy some place or stand, in some one of the market houses erected by the city of Baltimore.
