CHAP. 362.

An act to give effect within the State of Maryland, to the Will of the late George Chapman, of the State of Virginia. Passed June 2, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Will made valid
 that the will of George Chapman, late of Prince William county, in the State of Virginia, deceased, bearing date the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, and admitted to probate in the State of Virginia, at a court of quarter sessions, held for Prince William county in said state, on the second day of November, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, and the devise in said will contained, to Pearson Chapman, eldest son of the said George Chapman, of lands in the State of Maryland, shall be deemed, taken and held to be to all intents and purposes, as valid and effectual to pass on estate in fee in the lands so devised to the said Pearson Chapman, as against all persons who have taken estates in Virginia, under and by virtue of said will, and against all persons claiming or to claim by, from or under them, or any of them, as if the said will had been signed, sealed, published and declared in the presence of three competent and disinterested witnesses.

CHAPTER 362.

A supplement to the act, entitled, an act to declare and ascertain the right of citizens of this State to private roads or ways. Passed June 3, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Rail Road prohibited
 That where any private road or way has been, or shall be allowed to be laid out under the act to which this is a supplement, nothing in the said act contained shall be construed to authorise the making, upon such private road or way, of any rail road or rail way.
