And be it enacted, That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, before they finally pass upon the acceptance of this act, shall first cause an advertisement to be published for one week in the daily newspapers of the city of Baltimore, the expense of the said advertisement to be paid by the party or parties applying for the passage of this ordinance, at the same time notifying all persons interested, to make their objections, if any they have, to the passage of said ordinance, on or before some day to be fixed by the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Insolvent Debtors, for the city and county of Baltimore, and the Judges of Washington County Court, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Joseph S. Merrikin, Edward A. Slicer and David S. Reynolds, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly, passed for the relicf of insolvent debtors; Provided, that the said Joseph S. Merrikin, Edward A. Slicer and David S. Reynolds, shall in all respects, except that of proving residence, comply with the requisitions of said acts of Assembly, and that they satisfy the said Commissioners and Judges, that they did not come into this State with the
