**Location in Wards** SEC. 11. *And be it enacted*, That the Governor and Council, in the commissions to the aldermen respectively, shall designate the particular ward of the city of Baltimore, in which such alderman shall hold his place of official business, and it shall be the duty of such alderman accordingly, to hold his place of business aforesaid, in such designated ward; *Provided however*, that this act shall not go into effect, unless at the present or the next annual session, or any intermediate session of the City Council of Baltimore, this act shall be approved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and so soon after such approval as the Governor and Council shall appoint the aldermen, and they shall qualify as directed by this act, the then existing commissions of the justices of the peace of the city of Baltimore shall cease and have no effect; *and provided further*, that the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, may after such approval, at any time during the continuance of this act, increase the amount of the fees respectively chargeable by said aldermen, by an addition thereto of not more than twenty-five per centum of the amounts aforesaid, if it shall appear to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, necessary to make such increase in order to supply the funds necessary for the salaries of said aldermen.

**CHAPTER 367.**

**Passed May 24, 1835** *An act to authorise the exchange of certain Real Estate of John Walsh, in the city of Baltimore, and other exchanges in like cases.*

**On application, if to advantage, exchange authorised** **SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That upon application and proceedings thereon, in manner as is prescribed in cases of sales of Infants' Estates, to the Court of Chancery, or to Baltimore County Court, as a Court of Equity, it shall and may be lawful for said court, if it shall find the
