Resolution in favor of Milly Power. Passed February 23

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Milly Power, widow of Jesse Power, a soldier of the revolution, or to her order, during her widowhood, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services of her late husband.

Resolution in favor of Julia Rouark. Passed February 24

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Julia Rouark, widow of James Rouark, a soldier of the revolution, the half pay of a private, during her widowhood.

No. 43.

Resolution in favor of Mary Lynn. Passed February 25

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mary Lynn, widow of David Lynn, a captain in the revolutionary army, the half pay of a captain during her widowhood.
