CHAP. 90.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said Henrietta M. Ferguson shall be entitled to receive and to hold all the property, real and personal, that has descended or may descend to her as one of the heirs at law of Benjamin Porter, late of Cecil county, deceased, in the same manner, and to the same extent, as if she had never been married to the said William Ferguson, or been a feme sole at the time of the death of the said Benjamin Porter.

CHAPTER 89.

A supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Commercial Exchange Company of Baltimore.

Passed Feb. 18, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That in addition to the powers heretofore invested in the said Commercial Exchange Company of Baltimore, that such company be authorised to erect, or use their property already erected, or any part thereof, for a Hotel or Public Tavern, or any other purpose not contrary to law.

CHAPTER 90.

An act for the benefit of Noah Fairbanks.

Passed Feb. 18, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Insolvent Debtors for the city and county of Baltimore, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Noah Fairbanks, now in the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly, passed for the relief of Insolvent Debtors; *Provided*, the said Noah Fairbanks shall, in all respects, (except that of proving residence,) comply with the requisitions of said acts of Assembly, and that he satisfy said Commissioners that he did not come into this State with a view of obtaining the benefit of said insolvent laws.
