

provement Loan" and "State Loan of 1902." The moneys arising from the sale of these bonds were covered into the Treasury, being specifically dedicated to the purposes for which they were issued. Of the original issue of \$500,000 for the "State Building and Improvement Loan," there remained at the close of the fiscal year to the credit of the "State Building at Annapolis," which is now nearing completion, the sum of \$162,456.20. The credit to the two bond issues, as of September 30, 1902, is as follows:

These funds have been largely drawn upon since the close of the fiscal year, and will continue to be, as the work upon the various buildings progresses.
