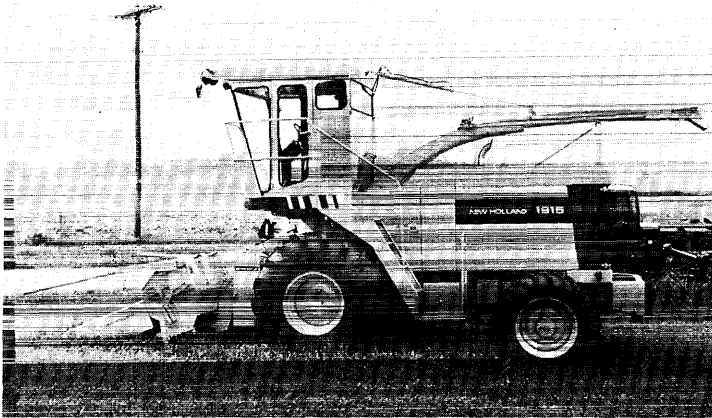

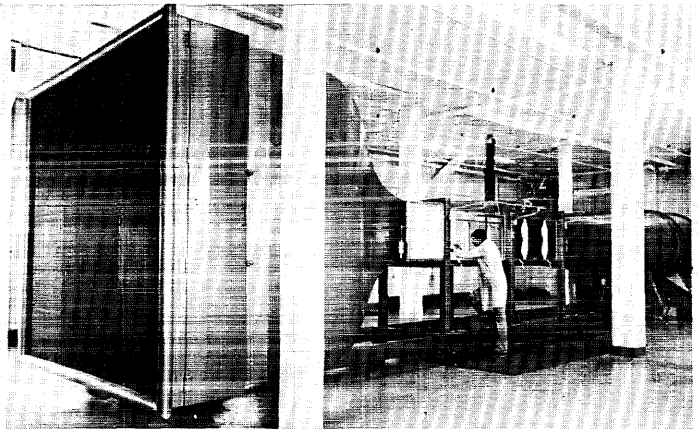


Ag-Ind Equipment
