Wheatley to Madison street, North Kensington; thence along the easterly side of Madison street, subdivision of North Kensington, to the middle of Perry avenue, prolonged; thence with the middle of Perry avenue to the place of beginning.

344. The citizens of the town shall, on the first Monday in May, in the year 1912, and every second year thereafter on the first Monday in May, at such place or places as shall be designated by the judges of election, between the hours of 2 o'clock P. M. and 7 o'clock P. M., elect by ballot one person Mayor of said town, who shall serve for a term of two years or until his successor is elected and qualified. The citizens aforesaid shall also elect, on the first Monday in May, 1912, two persons to be members of the Council of said town, who shall serve for a term of two years, or until their successors are elected and qualified, and they, together with the two councilmen elected at the election held in said town on the first Monday in May, 1911, for two years from said date and the Mayor, shall constitute the council of said town. The citizens aforesaid shall elect on the first Monday in May of each year thereafter two persons to be members of the council of said town, who shall serve for two years, or until their successors are elected and qualified. The qualifications for voters, Mayor and councilmen, shall be the same as prescribed, for voters by the laws of this State. They must have resided within the corporate limits of said town for at least six months next preceding their election. The Mayor and councilmen must continue to reside in said town during their terms of office, and they shall receive no fees or compensation for their services, except that the Mayor shall receive the fees allowed by said charter in section 349.

The Mayor shall preside at meetings and shall call such meetings from time to time as he may deem necessary, but in the event of the absence of the Mayor from any meeting the members of the Council present shall elect one of their own number to preside during his absence, who shall, for the time being, be clothed with all the powers and authority of
