They shall receive no pay for their services, except the Mayor, who shall receive the fees hereinafter allowed; and they shall serve for two years from the first Monday in June ensuing. (b) All residents of that portion of said town included within its limits by this act, and not heretofore included, shall, for all purposes of this charter, be considered to have resided in said town for the length of time they have resided in said annexed territory.

Elections shall be conducted by three judges appointed by the Mayor and council, and shall be held at some convenient place to be designated by the council; and the judges shall appoint a clerk of elections. The polls shall be opened at 6 A. M. and closed at 6 P. M., when the ballots shall be carefully counted, and on the result appearing, certificates of election shall be granted by the judges to the Mayor and council so elected, and a report of the same shall be filed with the Mayor and council.
