CHAPTER 8.

An Acr to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 71 of Article 1 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, entitled "Allegany County" and sub-titled "Cumberland," as enacted by Chapter 56 of the Acts of 1892.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section 71 of Article 1 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, entitled "Allegany County," subtitled "Cumberland," as enacted by Chapter 56 of the Acts of 1892, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows:

The Mayor and City Council shall cause to be maintained a registration of the legal voters in the city wards of said city, and the registration made under authority of existing law shall, together with such additions, changes and alterations as may be or become necessary, constitute such registration; said registration shall be made and corrected in the manner provided in the general registration law of the State, and shall specify the residence of the voter on each street, lane or · alley, and such registration shall be essential to the right of voting at any election under this charter, but shall not be conclusive evidence of such right to vote; said Mayor and City Council shall annually on or before the second Monday of February in each year, elect two persons of opposite politics to act as officers of registration, who shall sit as officers of registration in the council chamber at least five days, commencing on the last Monday of February in each year, for nine hours each day, and ten days' public notice of such sitting shall be given by advertisement in at least two of the daily newspapers of said city.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
