The governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, shall biennially appoint three persons of undoubted character, and selected with a view to skill and efficiency, managers of the Maryland hospital for the insane, who shall serve without pay, and hold their offices for six years, and until others are appointed in their stead, so that the said board shall always consist of nine members.
