engaged in the sale of intoxicating liquors, any minor to be of full age for the purpose of inducing any such licensed inn keeper, restaurant keeper or other person or persons engaged in the sale of intoxicating liquors to sell or furnish any intoxicating liquors to said minors shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than twenty five (\$25) dollars or undergo an imprisonment in jail for a period not exceeding thirty days; or both, in the discretion of the court.
