

orphans' court of his city or county, and every order of courts or register setting forth the nature of such paper or proceedings, with the proper reference to the place of recording the same, similar in every respect to the dockets as now required by law to be kept in the several offices of the equity courts of this State, and in addition to any books or dockets now required by law to be kept, and which additional docket shall be subject to the same supervision by State officials as other dockets now are; and the register of wills is hereby authorized to charge, tax and collect for each entry made thereon at the same rates as clerks of courts of equity throughout this State are now authorized to tax costs and collect therefor, and to account for such collection to the state comptroller. And be it further enacted, that this law shall take effect from the first day of June, A. D. 1908; provided, however, that nothing in this section contained shall in any manner be applicable to any papers, proceedings or orders to be filed or had in any estate, the administration of which is now pending or which may be pending prior to the said first day of June, but the same be proceeded with and concluded in accordance with the practice now in force in the orphans' court.
