81H. The engineer and viewers appointed under sections 81A-S1AA shall at all times keep an accurate account and report to the Board of County Commissioners the name and number of days such person was employed on the survey and the kind of work he was doing and any expenses that may have been incurred in going to and from the work, and the cost of any supplies or material that may have been used in making the survey.

81I. When the final report is completed and filed it shall be examined by the Board of County Commissioners, and if it is found to be in due form and in accordance with the law it shall be accepted, and if not in due form it may be referred back to the engineer and viewers, with instructions to secure further information, to be reported at a subsequent date to be fixed by the board. When the report is fully completed and accepted by the board a date not less than thirty days thereafter shall be fixed by the board for the final hearing upon the report, and notice thereof shall be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county and by posting a written or printed notice on the door of the courthouse and at five conspicuous places throughout the district, such publication to be made for at least two weeks before the final hearing. During this time a copy of the report shall be on file in the office of the Clerk of the County Commissioners, and shall be open to the inspection of any landowner or other person interested within the district.

81J. It shall be the duty of the clerk of the Board of County Commissioners to summon or cause to be summoned all defendant landowners, who have not signed the petition, when they are known to him or to the viewers, and if it shall appear to the clerk by affidavit or otherwise that the owner or owners of the whole or any share of any tract or tracts of land whose names are unknown and cannot after due diligence be ascertained by the petitioners, the clerk shall give notice in the nature of a summons to be given to all such persons by publication of the petition or of the substance thereof, and describing generally the tract or tracts of land as to which the owner or owners are unknown, with the order of the commissioners thereon, in some newspaper published in the county wherein the land is located. Such notice shall name the day upon which the Board of County Commissioners will hold their final hearing before declaring the drainage district established. This notice shall be printed for four consecutive weeks prior to the date of the hearing.
