

14.**The State Industrial Accident Commission.**

114. The State Industrial Accident Commission, constituted and organized as at present, and having and exercising the rights, powers, duties, obligations and functions now or hereafter conferred by law, shall constitute a separate Department of the State Government.

15.**Commissioner of Labor and Statistics.**

115. The office of Commissioner of Labor and Statistics is hereby created.

On January 1, 1923, all the rights, powers, duties, obligations and functions of the State Board of Labor and Statistics, under any provisions of law, including all the powers and duties transferred to and imposed and devolved upon said Board by the Acts of 1916, Chapter 406, shall be transferred to and thereafter be exercised and performed by the said Commissioner of Labor and Statistics, who shall be the lawful successor of the said State Board of Labor and Statistics to the same extent as if the said Commissioner had been named in said provisions of law as the official upon whom the said rights, powers, duties, obligations and functions were conferred.

16.**The Department of State Employment and Registration.**

117. The Department of State Employment and Registration is hereby established. The head of this Department shall be the State Employment Commissioner, who, appointed as at present, shall have and exercise all the rights, powers, duties, obligations and functions now or hereafter conferred by law. The said State Employment Commissioner shall be known hereafter as the Commissioner of State Employment and Registration, and shall devote all of his time to the duties of his office, including the duties heretofore performed by the Secretary and Chief Examiner as designated in the budget.
