Board assigned to Department of Employment and Registration

Board to examine diplomas; examination of other applicants

Board to prosecute; jurisdiction of justices of the peace.

Diplomas required, and examination by board, after January 1, 1895.

Examinations; certificates; only graduates examined after December 31, 1904.

Fines; disposition of; informer.

Meetings of board.

No appropriation from state.

Practice without diploma or examination unlawful.

Practitioners, who are; who may render services, though not licensed

Register; entries in; examinations.

Register of practitioners; publication thereof.

Rejection of applicants to practice.

Services of persons other than licensed practitioners; when obtained

State veterinary medical board.

Unregistered person practising; penalty.

WATERS, ICE AND SEWERAGE:

Access of agents of State Board to buildings, etc.

Appeal from orders of State Board; procedure; action to have precedence; appeals to Court of Appeals.

Appropriation for carrying law into effect.

Employees of State Board; compensation.

Explanation of terms.

Funds to be raised by county or city to comply with order of Board of Health; issue of bonds, stocks, etc., need not be submitted to vote; expenditures of public money to be approved by State Board.

Ice, State Board to have supervision over; permits; storage and handling of; rules and regulations.

Incompetent supervision or inefficient operation of water supply or sewerage system; order of State Board; competent person to be employed with approval of Board.

Insufficiency of water supply or sewerage disposal in county, city, etc., Board may pass orders to remedy.

Land not to be marketed nor permanent building erected until plans for water and sewerage submitted to State Board; Board may order additional plans and installation of system.

Manufacturing or industrial establishments; pollution of water by wastes from; State Board to order discontinuance of, and changes in, method; permits; plans showing existing methods to be submitted to State Board.

Penalties for failing to comply with order of Board of Health or of court on appeal.

Permits for public water supply or sewerage disposal; application for to be made to State Board; certified copy of plans to be filed with State Board; rules and regulations; State Board to act on application promptly.

Permits revocable and subject to change after notice; permits issued for a specified period.

Plans to be filed with State Board by authorities, corporations, etc., supplying water or conducting sewerage system for the public; insufficient plans; additional information

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
