Each supervisor of elections of Baltimore City shall receive an annual salary of twenty-five hundred dollars and each supervisor of elections of any of the counties of this State shall receive an annual salary of one hundred dollars, which salary may, in counties having more than fifteen polling places, be increased by the County Commissioners, in their discretion, to an amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars. These salaries and all other expenses incurred by them under this Article shall, upon their requisition, be audited by the County Commissioners of
