

default of payment of fine and costs so imposed shall stand committed until his fine and costs are paid and the bond herein provided for shall be put in suit for the recovery thereof, and upon conviction of a third like offense his license, in the discretion of the Court, may be suppressed, and in the event of a suppression of said license the same restrictions as to granting of license to the person so convicted and the place or premises whereat the person so convicted carried on business and violated this Act, shall be imposed as hereinbefore provided in this section in cases of unlawful sales to minors or persons under twenty-one years of age. Any person having a license under the provisions of this Act who shall hereafter be convicted of violating any of the other provisions of this Act or any of the conditions of his, her or their license shall be subject to the same fine and penalties as provided in this section for conviction of unlawful sale or sales to minors or persons under twenty-one years of age. Any person not a licensee who shall knowingly procure for or give to an habitual drunkard or to any person of intemperate habits any spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer in violation of the provisions of this Act shall be subject to a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, and to stand committed until fine and costs are paid. Any person not a licensee who shall procure for, sell, furnish or give to any person who is a minor or under twenty-one years of age any spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer shall upon indictment and conviction be subject to a fine of not more than one hundred dollars and to stand committed until fine and costs are paid. The license of any person who permits minors to frequent, loiter or loaf about his place of business, or disreputable or disorderly persons to make it a customary place of visitation or resort, may at any time on indictment and conviction be revoked by the Circuit Court for Allegany County, and the same person shall not again be granted license under this Act, within three years of the time of such revocation, and shall be subject to a fine of not less than fifty dollars, nor more than two hundred dollars, and in default of payment of fine and costs, shall stand committed until his fine and costs are paid and the bond herein provided for shall be put in suit for the recovery thereof. Remonstrances may be filed with the said clerk against any kind of a license at any time after such license has been granted under this Act or any other for the sale of liquors, and as soon thereafter as practicable the Court shall set the same down for hearing, notice of which shall be given to the licensee by service of a copy of the order for hearing, and when, upon such hearing, the Court shall, in its discretion, determine that the public welfare and the peace and good order of the community require it, revoke such license, and the person whose license is so revoked shall not again be granted license under this Act within three years from the date of such revocation. In the trial of all remonstrances, evidence of the general reputation of the applicant, licensee and house shall be admissible. Remonstrances may be filed immediately after the passage of this Act against all licensees for the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors or lager beer in any quantity whatsoever now in force in Allegany County. It is the intention of this Act that licenses to sell spirituous and fermented
