The Treasurer of Caroline County shall, upon taking office, beginning with the year 1922 and every four years thereafter, appoint a Deputy Treasurer who shall hold office for a term of four years, and the said deputy, so appointed, shall assist the treasurer in the performance of all the duties of said office under the direction and control of said treasurer, and said Treasurer for Caroline County shall be liable and responsible for all the acts and conduct of said deputy in the handling of any books, records or moneys of Caroline County in said office, and the said Deputy Treasurer shall receive a salary of eight hundred dollars (\$800) per annum.

If the person so elected treasurer shall fail to deliver such bond to the County Commissioners within sixty days from the date of his election, the said office shall be deemed vacant; and the County Commissioners, in such case, and also in case of death, resignation or failure to qualify, of said treasurer, shall fill the vacancy by the appointment of some suitable person to fill said vacancy for the remainder of the term, who shall make, execute and deliver the bond and take the oath as hereinbefore required.
