All persons who have resided in the town of Uniontown for six months, and who are qualified to vote for delegates to the General Assembly, and all adult male non-residents who may hold real estate in said town shall, on the first Saturday in April in each year, elect by ballot, one person for Burgess and four persons for Commissioners, all of whom shall have resided in the town one year previous to the day of election, and who shall each be the owner in his own right, of real or personal estate therein, assessed at not less than two hundred and fifty dollars; and the said officers shall be known as the Burgess and Commissioners of Uniontown.
