of said fines and ponalties, and costs attending the collection of the same, the offender may be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not exceeding twenty days.

They may provide by ordinance for the immediate arrest, without warrant of any person violating any town ordinance by riotous or disorderly conduct, or driving or riding through the streets, when in the judgment of the President or any of the Commissioners or the bailiff of the town, the delay necessary to the issuing of a warrant will be dangerous to the peace and quiet of the town, or the lives, limbs or property of the citizens; and when it shall appear that the offender is intoxicated so as to render it unsafe to permit him to drive through the streets, they shall provide for the removal of the horse and vehicle without the limits of the town, or for the deposit thereof in some place of security until the offender shall be sober, and may subject the property so taken and deposited to the payment of the costs of the proceedings and the keeping of said property until the same shall be released according to law, and may confine the offender in some secure place until he shall be sober.

- 300. The Commissioners shall have power to build a lockup or place of confinement for the reception of offenders, and the costs thereof shall be assessed upon the citizens of the town, and collected as other town taxes hereinafter provided for.

The President and Commissioners shall have power to establish the limits and width of the streets of said town, to open new streets, lanes and alleys in the town, and to straighten and increase the width of and remove all obstructions from those already located or used, and to provide for the paving of the said streets and sidewalks thereof, and for the keeping the same in repair, and for the proper drainage of said streets and alleys, and for that purpose to construct drains, sewers and culverts when necessary; to determine conditions and limitations for the erection of buildings in said town, and to require the removal of structures dangerous to public safety; and shall have authority to pass all proper and necessary ordinances and orders to that end; and shall have full power and authority to impose such fines and penalties as they may deem proper and necessary to carry out and enforce said ordinances and orders, and for that purpose shall have the same authority in the collection of said fines and penalties as are conferred
