The corporate limits of said town of Indian Head shall be as follows: Beginning at the bound-stone near the Indian Head Town Hall, marking one end of the boundary line of the U.S. Government Reservation and dividing the same from the land of Francis E. Mattingly, and running thence, continuing the course of said line, to the point where the north line of the State Road connects with the north line of the road continuing on into the said reservation; thence with the said north line of the said State Road, in an easterly direction, to the corner formed by the juncture of the land of the said U. S. Government with the land of John J. Gering; thence with the line dividing the two last mentioned lands to the Potomac River; thence with the said river to the point of intersection of same with the west line of the Glymont-Indian Head Wharf Road; thence with the last mentioned line to the aforementioned State Road, continuing the same course across the said State Road to the south line of the same; thence westerly with the south line of the said State Road to the northeast corner of the land of K. P. Krouse; thence with the west line of the 20-foot road dividing the said land of K. P. Krouse from a certain tract of land now owned by the said Francis E. Mattingly, and continuing the course of same, to Mattawoman Creek; thence down and with the said creek to the aforementioned line dividing the lands of the said Francis E. Mattingly and the U. S. Government as aforesaid; thence with the last mentioned line to the beginning.

1920, ch 590, sec. 3.

The citizens of said town of Indian Head having the qualifications prescribed for voters by the laws of this State and having resided in said town six months previous to any municipal election, shall annually on the first Monday in May elect three citizens, taxpayers of said town of Indian Head, who are assessed on the tax books of said Charles County as owning five hundred (\$500.00) dollars' worth of property within the corporate limits of said town of Indian Head, who shall have resided in said town for twelve months next preceding said election, as the Town Commissioners of Indian Head to serve for one year, from June 1st next succeeding their election or until their successors shall be elected and qualified. Said Town Commissioners shall receive no pay for their services as such, and they shall continue to reside in said town during their term of office; provided however, that there shall be no election of Town Commissioners in the month of May, 1920, but that Francis E. Mattingly, Frederick C. Shaw and Thomas Norman shall be and constitute the Town Commissioners of Indian Head, from and after the first day of June, 1920, until the first day of June, 1921, subject to the provisions of this Act, provided for the Town Commissioners elected for all other times than as herein in this section set forth, with power to fill vacancies occurring among their own number, or elsewhere in this Act set forth, for the Commissioners elected as herein otherwise provided.
