214. The preceding section shall only apply to the counties of Charles, Caroline, Kent, Talbot, Prince George's, Queen Anne's, Harford and Dorchester.

215. The Orphans' Court of Charles County shall hold but two sessions in a month in each and every year, beginning on the first and third Tuesday of each month, and shall sit but one day at a session unless actual and pressing business requires it to sit for a longer time.

216. The Judges of the Orphans' Court of Charles County shall receive the sum of six (\$6.00) dollars for every day's attendance upon the session of said court.

OYSTERS.*

217. It shall not be lawful for any person to employ any canoe, boat or vessel in catching or taking oysters with scoop, scrape, drag or dredge, or any similar instrument, within the waters or the tributaries of the Potomac River bordering upon the shores of Charles County, from the most eastern point of the headland, known as Posey's Bluff, to a buoy near the southern or southeastern point or prong of Herron Island; thence to a buoy near the end of Cobb Point Bar; thence to Piney Point Lighthouse; thence to the end of Saint George's Island Bar; thence to Cornfield Point in Saint Mary's County; and from the eastern extremity of Posey's Bluff, running along the Potomac River, including all the tributaries of said river in Charles County, as far as Nanjemoy Creek; nor shall any person take or catch oysters for sale within said waters otherwise than with tongs, as restricted and regulated by the provisions of Article 72 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Oysters."

218. Any person violating the provisions of the preceding section shall be fined a sum not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dol-
