original owner of such horses, hogs, sheep, and black cattle; and if any remain unsold, they shall be considered and treated as estrays under the laws of this State.

If any person residing in Allegany County shall claim any right and ownership to any horse, hog, sheep, or black cattle distrained as aforesaid, he shall, before some justice of the peace of the county, make oath that the same is bona fide his property, and that he did not acquire right thereto for the purpose of defeating the aforegoing provisions of this subtitle of this Article; and on making such oath, the justice shall certify the same under his hand and seal; and the owner, on presenting said certificate to the person having made the distress, shall be entitled to the property taken.
