If any person or persons shall wilfully violate any ordinance passed by said Commissioners, it is hereby made the duty of the bailiff to obtain from some justice of the peace of Dorchester County a writ for the arrest of the person or persons so offending; and he shall arrest the offender or offenders and take him or them before the said justice of the peace, who, if he shall find said offender or offenders guilty, shall fine them not less than one dollar nor more than ten dollars and costs, in his discretion, and the said person or persons so found guilty shall be sentenced to be committed to the county jail until the fine and costs are paid, and the fines when paid shall be paid over by the said justice of the peace to the Commissioners of the said town for the use of the corporation.

The said Commissioners shall also have power to impose license fees on any business, occupation or employment conducted in said town whether temporary or permanent; to provide for fire protection, police protection, for lights upon the highways of the town; to arrange for a supply of water for fire protection and for the use of its citizens; and to borrow money on their notes to an amount not to exceed three hundred dollars.
