

returns of said elections shall be made; and no one shall be eligible for the office of Mayor or Councilman of said town unless he shall be a real estate owner in said town and shall have resided therein for two years previous to his election; the first election under this Act to be regulated and conducted in the manner now regulated by law for the election of commissioners of Grantsville, and by the present board of corporation officers of said place.

The newly elected Councilmen, on the second Monday of June after their election, shall meet for organization and shall choose some one of their number as president of the board, whose duty it shall be to preside at all meetings, preserve order and to give such directions as may be deemed necessary by said board of councilmen to carry into effect the provisions of the subtitle of this Article, but said president shall not be entitled to vote at said meetings of said Council unless there should be a tie vote, and in that case he shall have the deciding vote; three members shall constitute a quorum of said board for the transaction of business.

209. Said Councilmen shall hold regular meetings on the first Monday of each and every month, and as much oftener as the proper conduct of the business of said town may require, and for their services they shall receive such compensation as shall be from time to time fixed by ordinance, the same not to exceed one dollar each, for each and every meeting so held and which they may attend; said councilmen to regulate by ordinance the compensation of the Mayor for his services, the same not to exceed twenty-five dollars in any one year.

210. It shall be the duty of the Mayor of said town to see that all ordinances of said town are duly and faithfully executed, and he shall appoint, subject to the confirmation of the Council, all such persons as agents and servants of said corporation as may be necessary to carry out the object and purposes of the incorporation, and to enforce the ordinances to be passed thereby, including a clerk to said Council, whose duty it shall be to attend all meetings of said Council, and to perform all other such duties as shall be from time to time prescribed by ordinance; and said clerk shall receive such compensation as said Council may by ordinance prescribe; and shall hold said office for one year from the date of his appointment; all ordinances passed by said Council shall be signed by said Mayor and president of said Council, and attested by said clerk, and be by said clerk entered at length in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall be open at all times for the inspection of any person or persons interested; and immediately upon the passage of any ordinance, or as soon thereafter as convenient, said clerk shall post printed or written copies of said ordinance so passed by said Council in five of the most public places of said town.
