220. The said Clerk to the County Commissioners shall, from the first day of January, 1924, receive such annual salary as the County Commissioners of Harford County shall direct, which salary shall be paid in equal monthly installments.

The County Commissioners may appoint such additional clerk or clerks, from time to time, as may be found necessary to the proper discharge of the duties of their office, under such safeguards as the County Commissioners may deem requisite, from time to time, and such additional clerk or clerks shall receive such sum or sums of money as said County Commissioners shall deem proper for the services rendered, which said sums shall be payable monthly during such time as said additional clerk or clerks may be employed. The County Commissioners may appoint such additional clerk or clerks from time to time as may be found necessary to the proper discharge of the duties of the County Treasurer, and said County Treasurer shall be allowed for such clerk's hire such sum or sums as the County Commissioners shall deem necessary for the proper conducting of the Treasurer's Office.

The compensation herein provided for all such clerks so employed shall be paid only upon vouchers duly issued by the County Commissioners and payable by the Treasurer of Harford County.
