It shall be the duty of said clerk to receive from the county commissioners of said county all moneys levied and collected for county purposes and also all other moneys which may be coming to said county from any source whatsoever, which said moneys, when so received, shall during banking hours of that day, be deposited by him to the credit of the clerk of the county commissioners of Howard County, in such bank or banks as the said county commissioners may designate, but no money shall be drawn from said bank or banks except by check signed by said clerk and countersigned by the president or some one member of said county commissioners acting for the time being as the president thereof; and said moneys shall be paid over by the said county commissioners to said clerk immediately after receiving the same, and said clerk shall receipt to said commissioners therefor.
