On the fourth Monday in April, 1915, at a regular election for a Commissioner of Chestertown, the duly qualified voters of Chestertown entitled to vote for Commissioners thereof, shall elect by ballot a Water Board which shall consist of three persons, each of whom shall have the same qualifications as those required of a Commissioner of Chestertown, one of whom shall hold office for one year, one of whom shall hold office for two years, and one of whom shall hold office for three years, and until their successors are elected and qualified, and the said duly qualified voters of Chestertown, entitled to vote for Commissioners thereof, shall elect by ballot on the fourth Monday in April, 1916, and in each year thereafter, at a regular election of a Commissioner of Chestertown, one member of said Water Board, with the qualifications above named, who shall hold office for three years and until his successor is elected and qualified, and the members of the Water Board of Chestertown to be elected as aforesaid shall qualify in the same manner as do the Commissioners of Chestertown, and said Water Board shall hold public meetings in January
