The council shall have power to pass all ordinances necessary for the good government of the town; may open and close streets, lanes and alleys; prevent, remove and abate or cause to be removed or abated, all nuisances or obstructions in or upon the sidewalks, streets, highways, lanes or alleys drains or water-courses, or in or upon any lot adjacent thereto; and to provide for imposing a fine upon any person causing, creating or maintaining any such nuisance or obstruction; to remove, or cause to be removed, houses or other obstructions or objects that may be dangerous to property, health or persons passing along or over any of the highways of the town, or residing in the neighborhood thereof; to make reasonable regulations in regard to buildings to be erected in said town, and to grant building permits for the same; to make and establish grades upon the streets and highways of the town; to cause sidewalks along the public streets and highways of said town to be graded, paved, repaired or improved; curbs to be set and gutters laid agreeably to the ordinances now in force, or which may be hereafter passed; to cause the water-courses,
