201. Said reporter shall attend and take full stenographic notes of all oral testimony and judicial opinions in all proceedings in said court at such times and in such cases as the court may direct. And said reporter shall make and furnish to any party, upon request, a typewritten transcript of any part of said notes, on payment by such party of the expense of such transcript at the rate of twenty cents for every hundred words.

202. The Crier of the Circuit Court shall receive three dollars and one-half (\$3.50) per day for every day his presence may be required and is in attendance on the Circuit Court, and this amount shall be in lieu of all other compensations and fees.

203. The messenger of the Circuit Court and Orphans' Court for said county, shall receive an annual salary of fifty dollars.

204. The clerk of the Circuit Court shall be entitled to an annual allowance from the county commissioners sufficient to supply his office with fuel.
