They shall make out and render to the County Commissioners, at their first meeting in October in 1916, and every six months thereafter, semi-annual reports, embracing a statement of their accounts and expenditures, with necessary vouchers of preceding half-year; and the said Commissioners shall have the power to reject such reports until the same shall have been made in a plain and business-like manner; and upon failure of said trustees to make correct and satisfactory reports, the said County Commissioners are authorized and empowered to dismiss any or all trustees and to fill such vacancies.
