

Town Clerk, such ordinance shall be suspended, and the Mayor and Town Council shall reconsider it, and if it be not repealed the Mayor and Town Council shall submit it to a vote of the duly qualified voters of said town at the next election, provided, however, that if the next election shall occur more than ninety days thereafter, the Mayor and Town Council shall call a special election for the purpose of deciding whether such proposed ordinance shall or shall not become a law, and the same shall become operative or repealed by a majority of the votes cast at this election.*

419. Prince George's county is divided into eighteen election districts according to their present names, bounds and limits, nine of them as they were established by the Code of Public Local Laws for Prince George's County of eighteen hundred and sixty, Article sixteen, section 57, except so far as they have been changed by subsequent legislation, to wit: by the following acts:

1868, Ch. 262, creating Laurel, or the 10th Election District.

1870, Ch. 226, fixing the boundary between Marlboro and Spalding District.

1872, Ch. 367, creating Brandywine, or the 11th Election District.

1872, Ch. 361, redefining the boundary between Prince George's and Montgomery counties.

1874, Ch. 487, creating Oxon Hill, or the 12th Election District.

1876, Ch. 147, creating Kent, or the 13th Election District.

1878, Ch. 180, creating Bowie, or the 14th Election District.

1882, Enlarging Spalding District.

1898, Ch. 130, creating Mellwood, or the 15th Election District.

1898, Ch. 328, changing the boundary between Surratt's and Piscataway.

1900, Ch. 308, creating Hyattsville, or the 16th Election District.

1902, Ch. 66, giving a new boundary between the 7th and 13th Districts.

1906, Ch. 345, creating Chillum, or the 17th Election District.

1910, Ch. 589, creating Seat-Pleasant, or the 18th Election District, and the respective sections of the above several acts relating to registration and polling places and other matters therein shall be and remain in force as enacted therein, so far as the same have not been repealed or amended by law with like force and effect as if incorporated in this section of this Code.
